

Entry visa application checklist

- Documents must be in Dutch, English, French, German or Spanish. If they are in a different language, you will need to have them translated.
- You must submit your application in person.
- Documents will not be returned to you, with the exception of your travel document and expired residence permit.
- To apply for a visa you will need to hand in your travel document.
- The competent authorities may ask you to provide additional supporting documents.
- Any fees will not be refunded if your application is rejected.

1. Application

1.1 A completed, signed <u>Schengen visa application form</u>

2. Travel documents

- 2.1 A valid passport or other travel document, together with a photocopy of the personal details page Please note:
 - Your travel document must have at least two empty visa pages.
 - Your travel document must not be more than 10 years old.
 - Your travel document must be valid for at least another 3 months after the date you intend to return to the Netherlands.

3. Photo

3.1 A <u>colour photo that meets Dutch requirements</u> This photo must have been taken in the last six months.

Please note: You do not need to bring a photo if you are applying for the visa via VFS Global or TLScontact. They will take your photo during your appointment.

4. Itinerary

4.1 Itinerary for travel to the Netherlands showing departure and arrival locations and times for each part of your journey.

Please note: make travel reservations that you can cancel if necessary.

5. Applications for children aged under 18 years

To apply for an entry visa for a child under the age of 18, you also need the following documents:

- 5.1 The <u>permission form</u>, completed and signed by both parents or guardians
- 5.2 A photocopy of the child's valid identity document (such as a passport) signed by both parents or guardians
- 5.3 A photocopy of the child's birth certificate showing the names of both parents
- 5.4 Any relevant legal documents, such as those relating to guardianship

6. Residence permit

If your residence permit has expired, you will need the following documents:

- 6.1 Your residence permit
- 6.2 A document showing the date you left the Netherlands or the Schengen area (such as a plane ticket or a stamp in your passport)

If your residence permit was lost or stolen, you will need the following documents:

- 6.3 A police report
- 6.4 A photocopy of the residence permit, if you have one
- 6.5 Your alien registration number (V number)
 You can find this number in letters from the Immigration and Naturalisation Service (IND) and on the back of your residence document.
